1. Foreign Mining Investment, Labor Market, and Local Trust: Evidence from Kyrgyzstan Gold Mine

Abstract: There has been controversy over the impact of foreign investment on workers' welfare and host country politics. This paper explores this question by analyzing Kyrgyzstan's dominant foreign invested gold mine, which accounted for 12.5% of Kyrgyzstan's GDP in 2020. A key finding is that the economic growth from foreign-invested mine undermines the trust of the beneficiary mining industry in local communities. Using geolocated data from household panel surveys in Kyrgyzstan from 2010 to 2016, the study shows Kumtor, this largest foreign mine, offers only mining-related workers better social benefits. Mining industry wealth is associated to economic grievances of the non-mining sector and social division. Higher corporate earnings of Kumtor causes inequality and lower trust in local leaders from mining workers.
